D'Oleo Named as Coordinator for Hispanic Ministry



Daniel D'Oleo, Pastor at Maranatha Multicultural Fellowship in Lancaster, began January 1 as the new Coordinator for Hispanic Ministry in ANE. While technically not a district staff position, Daniel will work closely with both the Hispanic Leaders' Advisory Committee and District Leadership to organize, promote, and connect Hispanic congregations and district leadership. This role is a pilot project and represents a working and relational partnership between Maranatha Multicultural Fellowship, Hispanic leaders, and the District.

Pastor D'Oleo is the fifth of eight children and his wife Oris, is the fourth of nine children. They have been married for fourteen years and have three children: Emely, 12; Benjamin, 10; and Melissa, 6.

Daniel completed a degree in Hispanic Ministry and Leadership from Goshen College in Indiana. He holds a degree in Management and Organizational Development from Eastern Mennonite University in Harrisonburg, Virginia. He is presently enrolled at Bethany Theological Seminary.

Pastor Daniel has been the pastor of Maranatha Multicultural Fellowship since October 2006. He has been a church leader for many years developing skills as a musician, teacher, deacon, church planter, pastor, administrator, and more. He is a visionary with an entrepreneurial spirit for service, outreach, church growth, as well as personal and professional growth.

Daniel is eager to begin his new role stating that, "I praise God for giving me the opportunity to serve Him as the Coordinator for Hispanic Ministry. I pray that such a responsibility allows me to bring more honor and glory to His name and increase my commitment to Christ and His church."

Renovations at Brooklyn First Church

On November 29, 1908, the brick church on Sixtieth Street in Brooklyn was consecrated as the First Church of the Brethren, Brooklyn, where Jesus Christ would be praised and worshiped. Over the years, time and elements caused some deterioration in the structure of the church and parsonage. Electrical concerns prompted the need for renovation. With the funds available in the local building fund, \$60,000 from an anonymous donor who challenged us to create matching grant, the funds are becoming available for these rather major renovations.

The electrical system of the parsonage and church is being upgraded and by the time you read this article, the much needed roof repairs will most likely be underway. Simultaneously, re-pointing of exterior walls and seal-coating of the façade of the building will take place. By the end of the spring, the church and parsonage will be secured from the elements. This will be a burden lifted from the shoulders of the congregation.

It is anticipated that \$120,000 will bring the electrical and gas supply up to code (New York City code is slightly more restrictive than Pennsylvania) and secure the building and roof from rain and moisture. This quantity will also provide updated appliances and furnishings for the parsonage and for the kitchen of the church. As of January 15, the matching grant now totals \$45,700.00. 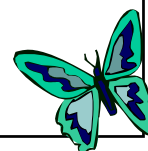

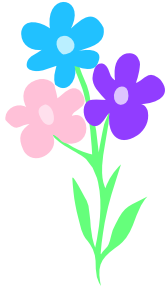

When the Peace and Social Justice Team at the Lampeter CoB learned about the Tax Rebate of 2008, they seized an opportunity to follow the teachings of Jesus.

Everyone had heard all about how to spend this money on TV's, IPODs and video games to stimulate the sagging economy. The idea was that increased consumerism was a sort of national duty. The team discussed what they thought Jesus might do with a Tax Rebate from Caesar, and knew their mission was to use this windfall money for the benefit of those in need and not on ourselves. 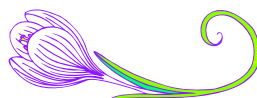

Mission Church Spotlight: Brooklyn First's "Open Gym for Jesus"

As the new pastor of the Brooklyn First Church, I noticed lots of youth in the streets after school and during the early evening. Our church has a half-court sized basketball court gym located in the rear of the church. Why not provide a safe place for youth to have some fun, exercise, and move these youth towards a relationship with Jesus Christ, instead of playing in the streets?

With support of the church and the district's *Local Outreach Grant*, the youth now play basketball, four-square, handball, and dodge ball in a safe environment. The first weeks brought about twenty-five youth from the 60th Street block. Halfway through the "Open Gym for Jesus" time, healthy snacks are given to the youth. It is during this time the youth ask questions about Jesus, the church, and the pastor. These youth do not care how much the pastor and helpers know, but they are seeing and knowing that the church cares for them and the community.



Open Gym for Jesus has surpassed being just a youth drop-in activity. The young kids find a place for safe play. Teenagers find a place where they can be themselves and do not need to be street tough. They are full of energy and play hard, but also find a place where they can ask about Jesus and begin a journey and a relationship with Him. Pray for this outreach activity and the youth to whom we are introducing Jesus.
