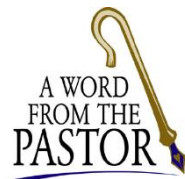

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,
 Jesus is the Prince of Peace. Don't you wonder what His assessment of the world's warring madness must be? There is a rise of nationalism, the "us first and nobody second" mentality that has grown around the world. It infects the culture of many countries, including our own, and it filters down into the mindset of communities, individuals, perhaps even the church.

In the **Joyful Noiseletter**, Anglican Bishop David Francoer wrote, *"Unless you have been living in a sensory deprivation tank for the last three years, you know that our nation and the world truly needs prayer. Holy Scripture reveals that God desires His people to pray for His will to be done! We invite you to join us in this endeavor of prayer...not just for any old thing, but for God to drive out the darkness and oppression in our land and transform it with His perfect will and merciful love!"*

The editor of that same publication, Cal Samra, asks, *"Where did all the peacemakers go?"* He laments the prayer experiences that he had in various worship services in different denominations. There were no prayers for peace in Russia-Ukraine, in the Holy Land, or in America...Sarma asks, *"Are there so few peacemakers in our society that we've forgotten who they are and how they think and behave?"* He observes that, *"Our feuding and uncompromising political leaders still haven't learned the lesson that violence and wars only plant the seeds for more violence and wars in future generations."*

Abraham Lincoln realized that our nation was in need of healing after the American Civil War. Historian John Avalon observed that in the last six weeks of his life, Lincoln excelled as a peacemaker. Avalon extols the final paragraph in Lincoln's second inaugural address as a model for peace in our times, as well: *"With malice toward none, with charity for all; with firmness in the right as God gives us to see the right, let us strive on to finish the work we are in, to bind up the nation's wounds, to care for him who shall have borne the battle, and for his widow and his orphan, to do all which may achieve and cherish a just and lasting peace, among ourselves, and with all nations."*

Go in peace, for you cannot go...where God is not.

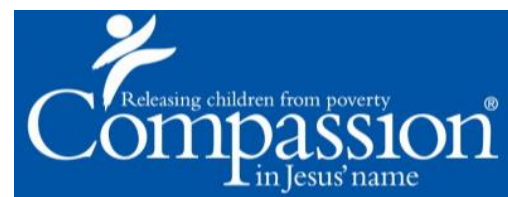

Free Spring Library News

The following are fiction books; some are part of a series.

Sisters of the Rockies Series by Misty M. Beller

Rocky Mountain Promise – When Lorelai Collins rescues a rare white orphaned buffalo calf, she unwittingly brings people to her Rocky Mountain ranch. When the attention turns threatening, she approaches the mysterious new trading post owner with a proposition, but they are soon faced with a greater threat – one that will test their limits and the love growing between them. (This is the second book in the series; the first book is: Rocky Mountain Rendezvous.)

Waters of Time Series by Jody Hedlund

Wait for Me – Dawson Huxham blames himself for his sister's death...until he briefly crosses time and discovers she's alive in the Middle Ages. Hoping to reconnect with her, he searches for the holy water that will help him visit the past for a longer duration. But he realizes he's not the only one looking for the miraculous water. Terrorists are threatening him and watching his every move. (This is the fourth book in the series; the other books are: Come Back to Me, Never Leave Me, and Stay With Me.)

What a Wave Must Be by Angela Hunt

Seventeen-year-old Maddie's world is shattered by her beloved father's unexpected betrayal and passing. When Maddie's mother sends her to live with her grandparents Susan and Frank, unexpected twists throw their lives into fresh turmoil – testing the very fabric of their faith. Can Susan help Maddie find hope, healing, and love despite unimaginable loss?

Appalachian Song by Michelle Shocklee

Bertie Jenkins has spent forty years serving as a midwife for her community in the Great Smoky Mountains of East Tennessee. Out of all the mothers she's tended, none affects her more than the young teenager who shows up on her doorstep, injured, afraid, and expecting one warm June day in 1943. As Bertie and her four sisters tenderly nurture Songbird back to health, the bond between the childless midwife and the motherless teen grows strong. But soon Songbird is forced to make a heartbreaking decision that will tear this little family apart.

Intertwined by Jennifer Slattery

Abandoned by her husband for another woman, Tammy Kuhn, an organ procurement coordinator, often finds herself in tense and bitter



moments. After an altercation with a doctor, she is fighting to keep her job and her sanity when one late night she encounters her old flame, Nick. She walks right into his moment of facing an unthinkable tragedy. Because they both have learned to find eternal purposes in every event and encounter, it doesn't take long to discover that their lives are intertwined, but the ICU is no place for romance...or is it? This could be where life begins again.

Texas Ever After Series by Karen Witemeyer

Fairest of the Heart – Penelope Snow becomes a personal maid for a famous actress whose troupe is leaving Chicago to tour the West. She hides her figure beneath shapeless dresses and keeps her head down. But she still manages to attract the wrong attention, leaving her prospects in tatters – and her jealous mistress plotting her demise. After his brother lost his life over a woman, Texas Ranger Titus Kingsley has learned to expect the worst from women and is rarely disappointed. So when a young lady found in suspicious circumstances takes up residence with the seven old drovers living at his grandfather's ranch, Titus is determined to keep a close eye on her. (This is the first book in the series.)

Alaskan Cyber Hunters Series by Kimberly Woodhouse

26 Below – In her new role as Emergency Operations Center director for Fairbanks, Alaska, Darcie Phillips prevents disasters. But none of her training can prepare her for the terror that's coming. As a cybersecurity specialist, Jason Myers is determined to ferret out any threats to the town he now calls home – and that includes his reckless brother and his ecoterrorist friends. When an old woman's wild prediction – widespread destruction as soon as the Fairbanks temperature falls to 26 below – hits national headlines, neither Darcie nor Jason sees a real risk to anything but tourism. (This is the first book in the series.)

The Spring Supper & Study will be Wednesdays starting April 3, at 6:00 pm in the fellowship hall with a potluck supper followed by the study at 6:30 pm. We will be using Kyle Idleman's **When Your Way Isn't Working: Finding Purpose and Contentment through Deep Connection with Jesus**. Here's the overview from the website:



In some of His final words to His closest friends, Jesus didn't suggest a five-year plan for success or a checklist of things to do. Instead, He offered a metaphor about what the good life really looks like: "I am the vine. You are the branches. Abide in Me." In other words, "No matter what happens next, the most important thing is to stay connected to Me."

In When Your Way Isn't Working, pastor and bestselling author Kyle Idleman offers a unique exploration of John 15 for all of us who are going through the motions and feel frustrated. Idleman reminds us that it's connection, not production, that leads to a fruitful life – relationships, not circumstances, that bring joy. He offers his distinctive, Biblical perspective on how to:

- Find greater rest, depth, and connection in your life
- Embrace freedom from the pressures of performance and production
- Recognize what you can't do makes room for what God can do
- Step out of isolation even when it feels scary
- Discover the top distractions that keep you from connecting to God – and how to counter them

In the end, the fruit of your life won't have to do with what you accomplished but with whom you stayed connected. Because no matter what happens next in this uncertain world, what matters most, lasts the longest, and brings the greatest joy is staying connected to the God who never leaves you.

A sign-up sheet is in the narthex and the books are there as well. This will be about a 5-week study with a DVD series. We will meet Wednesdays, April 3, 10, 17, 24 and May 1, all at 6:00 pm for Supper and 6:30 pm for Study. The schedule may change depending on how the series goes or if something else comes up.

Belita Mitchell, retired pastor and the denomination's first Black female moderator, passed away on Saturday, February 10, 2024 at her home in Mechanicsburg, Pennsylvania.

The first African-American woman to be ordained in the Church of the Brethren, Mitchell was called as the 2007 Annual Conference Moderator. She served as pastor to Church of the Brethren congregations at Imperial Heights (California) and Harrisburg First (Pennsylvania). Along with her husband, Don, she was recognized in 2017 by the denomination's Intercultural Ministries as a significant leader in efforts to make the Church of the Brethren an intercultural church, and in 2022, she was the preacher for the final worship service at Annual Conference in Omaha.

A celebration of life service will be held for Belita at First Church of the Brethren, 219 Hummel Street, Harrisburg on **Saturday, April 20**, with viewing at 10:00 am and service at 11:00 am. A luncheon will follow.

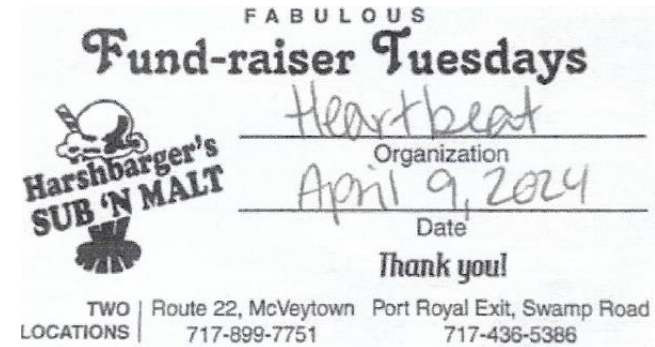
