Course Description and Objectives

Course Description:

Pastors and church educators have long been inspired by the imagery of Deuteronomy 6:7, which instructs us to recite God's words to our children and talk about them at home and when we are out and about. We desire to help children, youth, and adults cultivate a way of life, to help them link stories from the Bible to everyday living, and to encourage them to live out Jesus' teachings in their neighborhoods and communities. But for far too long, we've attempted to do that in age-defined classrooms on Sunday mornings.

In this course, students will explore ways to break out of the Sunday school box and nurture an everyday faith in church, home, and community. We will look at recent research on the pivotal role of families in the faith formation of children and how churches can empower them to fulfill that role. And we will discuss ways to build relationships across generations, helping people of all ages make connections that spark their moral imagination for how God and the Holy Spirit are working in their lives and the world.

Course Objectives:

Upon completion of this course, students will be able to:

- 1) Articulate an understanding of recent research on the spirituality of children and youth.
- 2) Articulate an understanding of the crucial role of families in the faith formation of children and youth.
- 3) Demonstrate an understanding of the role of the congregation in helping parents and caregivers share their faith and values with their children and youth.
- 4) Identify and shape Christian practices that nurture children and youth's relationships with God.
- 5) Demonstrate practical skills in resource development and leadership related to building relationships across generations.

Joan Daggett is an ordained minister in the Church of the Brethren, serving previously as a pastor, an associate district executive in the Shenandoah District, and as the executive director of the Brethren and Mennonite Heritage Center in Harrisonburg, VA. She joined the staff of Shine: Living in God's Light as project director in 2016, where she continues to use her passion for Christian education and discipleship formation.
