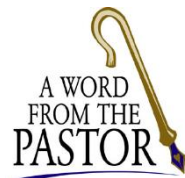

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Why are we to beware the ides of March? In Ancient Rome, the ides of March came on March 15 and it was traditionally the deadline for settling debts. It has been made famous by William Shakespeare when the soothsayer warned Julius Caesar to "Beware the ides of March". Caesar ignored the warning and was assassinated on March 15, 44 BC.

This year, the day before the ides of March is the day for our clocks to spring forward as we celebrate another hour of daylight in the evening, and our bodies adjust to the time change. Beware of the earlier start as you may find yourself being late if you forget to make the adjustment.

Sometimes adjustments are expected but other times we are hit with unexpected circumstances. One year ago, we had to begin making major adjustments and we are still working through the pandemic health, economic, and spiritual challenges.

It may be good to take to heart John-Roger and Peter McWilliams advice: "Being content, satisfied and joyful no matter *what* happens is a radical concept – but it's also basic rule of adult life. Without this rule – to at least *aspire* to – we live in a land of Victims and Victors, of endless finger-pointing and name-calling...If you want to fulfill your Dream, look more for 'What's next?' than 'Who's wrong?'"

As Brothers and Sisters in Christ, we should confidently look forward as we approach the Spring Equinox. Flowers begin to bloom and so will we as more opportunities return to celebrate the normal rhythm of life. There may be weeks or months to wait, but it will be good to see big smiles and give warm hugs to those whom we greet in Christian love.

March Food Pantry Needs: Diapers

March!!!! It's here already!! Time keeps moving on, even if we are not ready for it yet.

As we look back on our Witness areas of giving, we want to highlight the giving that is going to our Juniata County Food Pantry.

The donations given are measured by pounds and if we are giving paper products, the weights will be lower. During October and December our donations measured 11 pounds. That does not sound like much but you also need to look at the money given through Give Me 5! to see the impact our church has in its contributions to the Pantry. Last year that amounted to over \$5,000!

The Food Pantry receives food from the Central PA Food Bank, but not household staples, so this is the reason we ask for donations of other items. I encourage anyone to give a day and volunteer at the Food Pantry – you will see how important the household items are to supplying those in need some of these essential items. Thank you to all who have given tissues during January and February and to Lucille Saner for delivering them to the Food Pantry. For the months of March and April we will be collecting diapers.

Our Outreach during January goes out to our local Fire Companies, Belleville Meat Canning, which you have seen, was a success. Also, during January contributions were sent to Days for Girls, and Golden Years Ministry.

February's support goes to Children's Aid Society and to the SO PA Meat Canning.
