



The following are fiction books; some are part of a series.

My Dearest Dietrich by Amanda Baratt

Based on a powerful true story! Maria never intended to fall in love with Dietrich Bonhoeffer, a German theologian under surveillance by the Gestapo. But when she does, they find themselves torn between love for one another and Dietrich's determination to fight the evil in his homeland.

Defend and Protect Series by Lynn H. Blackburn

Malicious Intent – Dr. Ivy Collins, founder and CEO of Hedera, Inc, is ready to begin clinical trials of her company's cutting-edge prosthetic. Her work has been heralded by government, medical, and advocacy groups and everyone hopes the device will be a success. Well, almost everyone. Someone is trying to sabotage Hedera and the launch, but to what purpose – and how far will they go to get what they want? (This is the second book in the series; the first book is <u>Unknown Threat</u>.)

Closer Than She Knows by Kelly Irwin

Court reporter Teagan O'Rourke has written official records for dozens of homicides but she never thought she'd be a victim – until now. When a serial killer leaves her threatening notes, she turns to her friend Max Kennedy for help. As the obsessed murderer draws closer, can Max protect Teagan – and tell her of his love – before it's too late?

Child of Mine by David & Beverly Lewis

Flight instructor Jack Livingston has been raising his eight-year-old adopted niece, Natalie, since the accident that took her parents' lives. When he travels, Natalie is tenderly cared for by her Amish nanny, Laura Mast, who loves the little girl as her own. Eight excruciating years ago, Kelly Maines' baby was kidnapped. Determined to find her child, Kelly has tirelessly pursued every lead to its bitter end. And now, with the clock ticking, one last clue from a private investigator ignites a tiny flame of hope: Just a few miles away lives a young girl who matches the profile. Can this be, at long last, Kelly's beloved daughter?

Fallout by Carrie Stuart Parks

When an SUV crashes into the school, Samantha Williams rescues her students. Her car gets broken into and her purse has disappeared. But the mysteries are just beginning: skeletal remains, blackmail, murder, a ghost town, and a secret government project. Why does Samantha seem to be at the center of everything?

Echoes of the Past Series by Liz Tolsma

What I Would Tell You – Mathilda Nissim watches in horror as the Germans invade her beloved city of Salonika, Greece. What angers her most is the lack of resistance her people put up to their captors. In secret, and at great risk to her life, she continues to publish her newspaper, calling her people to action. She doesn't trust God to help them. When she and her husband find out they are expecting a child, Mathilda may have to resort to desperate measures to ensure her daughter's survival. (This is the first book in the series.)

If It Rains by Jennifer I. Wright

It's 1935 in Oklahoma, and lives are determined by the dust. Fourteen-year-old Kathryn Baile, a spitfire born with a severe clubfoot, is coming of age in desperate times. Once her beloved older sister marries, Kathryn's only comfort comes in the well-worn pages of her favorite book, *The Wonderful Wizard of Oz.* Then Kathryn's father decides to relocate to Indianapolis, and only the promise of a surgery to finally make her "normal" convinces Kathryn to leave Oklahoma behind. But disaster strikes along the way, and Kathryn must rely on her grit and the ragged companions she meets on the road if she is to complete her journey.

Also during the month of May, Solid Rock International is celebrating the Dominican Staff. They serve the San Juan region and the focus this year is encouragement! Please remember them in your prayers!

A communication from Sat-7 brings the message to the Middle East, an earthquake update. Most international rescue or relief groups have left the country. Christian groups are still there. The Turkish people ask Christians, "Why are you helping us?" Sat-7 remains, broadcasting through the nations satellite system. Staff reports say there is a growing number of new followers among the survivors. The letter closes with this: someone from Iran, "I thank God for the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. I wanted to have fellowship with you, and I am so glad that we have you believing brothers and sisters, because as a result of what you are doing, many of my compatriots in Iran have come to know the God of love, as I have done. It was through watching your program that I came to faith I thank God for you, for helping us to know the God of love despite all the constraints that exist in Iran. May god bless you."

The CWS Health Kits are filling up the chest! Thank you to those who have completed Kits. I encourage you to attend the event in Carlisle at the Material Resource Center. This Center is the hub of distributions for the Kits around the world. Our church has worked there for many years and we have missed going since 2020. The staff there needs this encouragement!


