Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Annual Conference is past, but District Conference is yet to come. There is much to prepare for, and I pray that we can all give attention to Paul's call to the church in Rome to be of "One heart and one voice for the glory of God."

Over twenty-five years ago, I found a message by William M. Schwein titled **GETTING BETTER AT GETTING ALONG**. He began, "In The <u>Screwtape Letters</u>, C. S. Lewis suggested satirically that one of the best allies for Satan's cause may be the 'church itself'. Doubts about the church could be sown if a potential Christian began to see the contrast between the invisible church and the one filled with his neighbors. Lewis says, 'Make his mind flit to and fro between an expression like 'the body of Christ and the actual faces in the pew'."

Paul's letters were sent out to churches to correct and encourage them in the midst of their many differences. As Schwein says, they were to "Accentuate the positive. They were to emphasize what drew them together, not what set them apart...In spite of differences, we are bound by what really matters which is love for our Lord and for one another. What holds us together is the fact that '...our hopes, our aims are one...' as a beloved hymn reminds us."

May this be our resolve at Free Spring, that what we say and do is for the glory of God and for the good of our neighbors. Pray that it would also be the resolve of our Southern Pennsylvania District as we look forward to meeting in Chambersburg this September.

### **Free Spring Library News**

The following are fiction books; some are part of a series.

Annie Pederson Novels Series by Colleen Coble

<u>Break of Day</u> – Law enforcement officer Annie Pederson's life has been rocked by tragedy, but things finally seem to



be heading in the right direction. Her relationship with the love of her life – who's also the biological father of her precious daughter – has never been better, and it looks like an engagement ring is in Annie's future. She's also slowly building back trust with her sister, Sarah, after a separation that has lasted for decades. When a man escapes law enforcement custody and Sarah's safety is suddenly in question, Annie's personal and professional lives once again merge. Meanwhile, her investigation of hikers who have gone missing in the remote woods of Michigan's Upper Peninsula puts her in the cross hairs of a deadly game. (This is the third book in the series; the other books are Edge of Dusk and Dark of Night.)

### Children of the Stars by Mario Escobar

In this WWII tale of escape, sacrifice, and hope, brothers Jacob and Moses Stein are hiding in Paris with their aunt. In August of 1942, gendarmes whisk them away to a Nazi detention camp, where they – along with thousands of other children, women, and men – must subsist without food or water. The boys flee, but will they find safety?

### Cape Cod Creamery Series by Suzanne Woods Fisher

<u>The Secret to Happiness</u> – Callie Dixon sets her goals and reaches them – so how did this executive chef end up in a small ice cream shop on Cape Cod, sharing a room with her cousin and refusing to set foot in the kitchen? It will take the charm of a young boy and his quiet, steady father, to help her find the answers – and maybe the secret to happiness. (This is the second book in the series; the first book is <u>The Sweet Life</u>.)

### Maple Falls Romance Series by Kathleen Fuller

<u>Two to Tango</u> – Olivia Farnsworth likes her job as head librarian. She likes spending time with her Aunt Bea and with her close-knit group of friends. She likes attending the cinema's monthly Vintage Movie Night. What she does not like is stepping outside her comfort zone. But when Kingston Bedford, her best friend's older brother, runs into her at the movies, that's exactly what she does. She takes a chance on the gorgeous pediatrician she's known her whole life – only to crash land her way into heartache. Twice. One year later, she's determined to avoid him forever. Aunt Bea and her Bosom Buddies, however, have other ideas. Plans that begin with

ballroom dancing lessons...and end with one of the Bosom Buddies getting a taste of her own matchmaking medicine. (This is the fourth book in the series; the other books are <u>Hooked on You</u>, <u>Much Ado about a Latte</u>, and <u>Sold on Love</u>.)

### Hope Harbor Series by Irene Hannon

<u>Windswept Way</u> – Buying a haunted house was never in Ashley Scott's plans, but when an intriguing opportunity drops into her lap after a major setback, she finds herself trekking cross-country to Hope Harbor on the Oregon coast to launch a new life. (This is the ninth book in the series; the other books are <u>Hope Harbor</u>, <u>Sea Rose Lane</u>, <u>Sandpiper Cove</u>, <u>Pelican Point</u>, <u>Driftwood Bay</u>, <u>Starfish Pier</u>, <u>Blackberry Beach</u>, and <u>Sea Glass Cottage</u>.)

### Ryland & St. Clair Series by Nancy Mehl

<u>Cold Pursuit</u> – Ex-FBI profiler River Ryland still suffers from PTSD after a case went horribly wrong. Needing a fresh start, she moves to St. Louis to be near her ailing mother and opens a private investigation firm with her friend and former FBI partner, Tony St. Clair. They're soon approached by a grieving mother who wants them to find out what happened to her teenage son who disappeared four years ago. River knows there's almost no hope the boy is still alive but his mother needs closure, and River and Tony need a case, no matter how cold it might be. But as they follow the boy's trail, which gets more complicated at every turn, they find themselves in the path of a murderer determined to punish anyone who gets in his way. As River and Tony race to stop him before he kills again, an even more dangerous threat emerges, stirring up the past that haunts River and plotting an end to her future. (This is the first book in the series.)

### Double Indemnity by Robert Whitlow

After a hunting accident claims Matt Thompson's life, his wife hires attorney Liz to determine who will inherit millions. Pastor Connor offers Liz insights into the couple's rocky marriage. As Liz and Connor's relationship blooms, they're caught in the tailspin created by Matt's death. Was it an accident? Could *Connor* be guilty of the unthinkable?

families fed while everyone else enjoys summer vacation. Thanks to all of you who are bringing in fresh produce from your gardens! What a blessing straight from the Lord is fresh produce to those who rarely taste any but the canned variety, and very little of that.

In June 2023, the Food Pantry served 242 families in need – a total of 642 individuals. In addition, our Summer Backpack Program provided over 2,580 lunches for 129 school age children who otherwise would be facing a hungry summer vacation.
