Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ, Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

our culture this seems to have become the "great omission".

### If I Were You by Lynn Austin

Friends before World War II, Audrey Clarkson and Eve Dawson became separated. The two find each other again in the United States, but will Audrey ever be able to forgive Eve for her deception?

### The Secret Keepers of Old Depot Grocery by Amanda Cox

For decades, three generations of women of Old Depot Grocery have been keeping secrets from each other. When Sarah returns home with hopes of running the store, the long-buried past will be brought into the light and threaten not only to destroy the family business but sever the family ties.

### In the Shadow of the River by Ann H. Gabhart

Jacci Reed loves her life on the Ohio River in 1896 as part of the Kingston showboat family but shadows of her past, and the death of her mother, linger in her memory. With the help of the showboat owners' son, can she find answers before those shadows overtake her and threaten her life?

### Broker of Lies by Steven James

each site. The first one is a police records check for volunteers. The second one is the PA Child Welfare clearance application; it will take about 14 days to process and is good for 5 years. Both are free as long as you follow the volunteer routes.
