Extreme Measures Series by Lynette Eason

<u>Countdown</u> – Flight paramedic Raina Price's past has marched back into her present – and it wants to kill her.

With a stalker who knows her well determined to end what he started, US Marshal Vince Correlli vows to protect her at all costs – even if ends his career. (This is the fourth book in the series, the other books are <u>Life</u> <u>Flight</u>, <u>Crossfire</u>, and <u>Critical Threat</u>.)

Ladies of the Lake by Cathy Gohlke

Four young women bond at Lakeside Ladies Academy – until WWI strikes, Adelaide and Dorothy fall for the same German-American man, and a horrific explosion rips the sisterhood apart. Years later, Dorothy, now Lakeside's headmistress, invites "Rosaline Murray" to her daughter's commencement ceremony – never suspecting Rosaline is her former friend Adelaide. Can broken relationships be mended?

Trace of Doubt by DiAnn Mills

Fifteen years ago, Shelby Pearce was sent to prison for the murder of her brother-in-law. Now she's out on parole. FBI agent Denton McClure believes she embezzled \$500,000 from her brother-in-law's account. When he goes undercover to crack the case, he begins to doubt her guilt. Can he discover the truth – before somebody silences her forever?

Relative Silence by Carrie Stuart Parks

After a string of losses, Piper Boone retreats to her childhood home on Curlew Island, only to narrowly survive a mass shooting in a cafe. When the police discover a connection between the shooter and other island murders, the suspects are family. Can forensic artist Tucker Landy help Piper unravel the Boones' true history?

Where the Blue Sky Begins by Katie Powner

When a shallow but charming financial advisor from Seattle and an eccentric terminally ill woman in rural Montana are thrown together for the summer, their unconventional friendship will produce surprising results. Eric and Eunice couldn't be more different, but they each must learn lessons about themselves – what friendship really means, and how to let go. When the end of summer comes, neither of them will ever be the same.

Star of Persia by Jill Eileen Smith

Persian King Xerxes calls every governor and satrap to Susa for a war

council and feast, but his efforts end in his favorite wife's banishment. When he discovers Esther, the beautiful Jewish ward of Mordecai, he makes her his queen – and the palace intrigue begins. A fresh retelling of the Biblical story packed with suspense, romance, and faith.

Until Leaves Fall in Paris by Sarah Sundin

During the 1940 Nazi occupation of Paris, American Lucie, owner of Green Leaf Books, aids the Resistance by passing secret messages within her volumes. Meanwhile, factory owner Paul sells to the Germans – but sabotages his product. When Lucie and Paul meet at her store, attraction ignites. Will his business dealings with the Nazis derail their romance?
