

But when the annual Christmas catalog arrives and the boys start obsessing over all the toys, the two friends realize they need to start by teaching their children the true significance of the holiday. Dangerous Beauty by Melissa Koslin

Liliana is determined to take back her life after escaping human traffickers in Mexico. Seeking safety in America, she's aided by wealthy Meric. Her pursuers won't stop until she's theirs. What personal risk will the American take to keep her safe?

The Heirloom by Beverly Lewis

After her widowed father remarries, nineteen-year-old Clara Bender is no longer needed to help run his household. Marriage seems like her best hope of moving out, but there are few young men in her tiny Indiana Amish community. When she comes across letters from her mother's aunt Ella Mae Zook, she sets off to visit Lancaster County's Hickory Hollow to decide where her future lies. The Mercy Tree by Sharlene Maclaren

In 1955, well-respected Pastor Henry Griffin knows scandalous affairs are never talked about and divorce is rare. When a letter arrives that could upend his career and break up his beautiful family, the secret about his time stationed in Japan begins to unravel. Is there room for gentleness, faith, and redemption under the Mercy Tree?

The Wind Blows in Sleeping Grass by Katie Powner

Pete is content in his simple life in a remote Montana town, but elderly widow Wilma is busy meddling in Pete's life to make up for past wrongs.

When the sister Pete was separated from as a child shows up, Pete must confront a difficult past, and Wilma discovers her long-awaited chance at redemption may come at too high a price.

The Book of Lost Friends by Lisa Wingate

Louisiana, 1875: In the tumultuous aftermath of Reconstruction, three young women set off as unwilling companions on a perilous quest: Lavinia, the pampered heir to a now-destitute plantation; Juneau Jane, her illegitimate free-born Creole half-sister; and Hannie, Lavinia's former slave. Each carries private wounds and powerful secrets as they head for Texas, following dangerous roads rife with ruthless vigilantes and soldiers still fighting a war lost a decade before.

Christian Education Commission

As mentioned in August's and September's newsletters, Child Protection Clearances must be updated for our insurance. Anyone working with children and youth during Sunday School, Junior Church, VBS, or any other church-sponsored youth event must have Clearances. So far, we've only received 2 sets of Clearances. **This being the**

case, we'll have to shut down any youth-related activities. Please go to the following websites and follow the directions within each site. The first one is a police records check for volunteers; the second one is the PA Child Welfare clearance application – it will take about 14 days to process and is good for 5 years. Both are free as long as you follow the volunteer routes.

If you already have clearances for your workplace or other youth involvement (sports or youth clubs), feel free to provide these. If you have any questions, please see Rich Walters or Shari Book. Additionally, per church/district policy we may need more later or will have to provide training meetings to keep current. This is being reviewed and we will update everyone as soon as possible.

The Fall Bible Study was held each Wednesday in October with a potluck supper in the fellowship hall and concluded November 1 at Pastor Terry's cabin. We used Max Lucado's <u>God Never Gives Up on You</u>. It was about encouragement to those of us who mean well, but don't always succeed. Witness Commission December Food Pantry Delivery by: Judy Hoffman

Christmas Tree Festival at Camp Eder is December 8 & 9 at 5:00-9:00 pm. The woods will be illuminated with lots and lots of Christmas lights, and warm fires. There will be hay rides, tree decorating contest, turkey dinner and bake sale, music, and a luminary garden. And don't forget – kids' activities and s'mores!!!!

Thank you for the continued donations to the Food Pantry. Judy Hoffman delivered the items from the last two months. Thank you to her! The counts were 68 toothpastes and 121 toothbrushes, WOW!!! There were also groceries that were donated. We are collecting laundry detergent through the end of December. They will especially like smaller bottles or boxes for families of 2 or 3.

From the Pantry's 2023 report...during the year, they served an average of 221 families, 585 individuals, 139 elderly, 278 adults, and 167 children. The average family size is 2.5 members. This year they served 156 new families and 30 families come every month. Through the summer backpack program, 167 kids received 7,980 lunches. The senior boxes serve an average of 53 low-income seniors during the month. This is accomplished with volunteers that worked 6,876 hours during the year!!!!

Cookies, Cookies, Cookies!!!! I hope all our bakers are planning on the kinds of cookies you are bringing to pack for the Carlisle Truckstop Ministry. Can we fill more than 268 bags this year? See you on Saturday, December 2 at **8:30 am**.

There will be a Harshberger's Fund Raiser for Heartbeat on Tuesday, January 9, 2024. Coupons will be provided in the bulletin. The Center is in need of maternity clothes, baby wipes, formula, Bible story books or DVDs, and wash cloths or bath towels. If you have any of these items to donate, you may drop them off at the center in Millerstown.


Sunday School Classes
