Session I: What is Love Feast

(10:30-11:30 am), Location-Chapel, Nicarry Meetinghouse

For Brethren, the Love Feast has included elements of preparation, feetwashing, a shared meal, and communion, but there have been changes in how these elements have been lived out over the years. This session will focus on the theological meaning and movements of the Brethren Love Feast tradition over the past 300 years.
